AQG Guild Meeting Minutes May 14, 2018

The Guild meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by President Judy Stewart.

Minutes: Sherri Dodds, challenge chair added a correction. The ugly fat quarter block should be 12 inch square. Carrie Weindorf moved to approve the April minutes with the above correction. Sherry Williams seconded the motion. The vote was passed to accept minutes.

Treasure's Report: Treasurer Mary Jane Beard provided report regarding April's finances. Income: \$ 608.95 (\$225.00 membership, \$59.00 fundraising, \$320.00 workshop, \$4.95 interest). Expenses: \$ 256.60 (\$216.98 equipment, \$39.62 newsletter).

Mary Jane Beard also shared that Geannine Ott's fabric sale yielded \$652.75 last month. This will be reflected in next month's report. Treasure report has been posted on-line.

\$5,000 from checking was deposited into the CD of \$10,000 that matured on 4/15/18 making the total \$15,000. This will be invested for 1 year.

Committee Reports:

AWOL: Leah Sample, Eddie and Melissa Landreth, Jim Gatling, Sally Burrup, Chairs. Leah Sample announced fall AWOL will be held at C. A. Vines Arkansas 4-H center in Ferndale on October 12-14, 2018. Registration forms are available tonight at the meeting. A deposit of \$25.00 is required to register, and registration will be due by October 1, 2018.

The 3rd Saturday sit and sew will be held May 19, 2018 at the Baptist Health Southwest campus.

Challenges: Sherri Dodds, Chair. Sherri is collecting 'ugly fat quarters' for the upcoming challenge. She encouraged everyone to bring 100% cotton 'ugly fat quarters' in order to participate. Members will 'exchange' an ugly fat quarter and create a 12" disappearing ugly block which will be due in June. There has been 50 blocks turned in thus far. She thanked all those that have participated. Further details regarding this challenge will be on the AQG website and in the newsletter.

Community Service: Meg Cullum, Chair shared that she will be collecting quilts to be donated to Brookdale, a senior living community in Conway. There are over 80 residents that are wheelchair bound. Therefore lap size quilts will be needed. Quilt sizes range from 36x36 to 50x50. Population of the senior living community consists of women, men, and some veterans. She is asking for fabric donations of background fabric such as white, off white, tan, cream, grey colored fabric. She plans to utilize background fabric with the quilt kits. A community service project link can be found on the AQG website. Links to free patterns for those that want to donate a quilt utilizing charm squares or fat quarters can be found on the AQG website as well. 16 quilts have been donated thus far. Anyone that donates will be given a ticket, and there will be a drawing at the end of the year for a prize. Any remaining donation guilts from juvenile fabric unsuitable for an adult are welcome and can be donated to The Call foster care program.

Fundraising: Chair needed. Judy Stewart shared to contact her if anyone was interested in purchasing a name tag. Sherry Williams, membership chair will also be collecting money for name tags which are \$12.00 each. License plates with AQG logo are also available to purchase.

Hostess: Cynthia Quick and Meg Cullum, Chairs.

Cynthia Quick shared that there were 63 members present this evening. We extend our welcome to our 4 guests with us tonight as well- Sharon Sheilds, Jennifer Horn, Roger Burrup, and Lucy Neal. Door prize winners this evening: Leah Sample, Donna Toombs, Llewellyn Webster, Jim Gatling. The winner of the fat quarter monthly exchange tonight was Alicia Bell. Cynthia also reminded members to bring a white, ivory, or cream fat quarter for the June fat quarter exchange, and there will be more details in the newsletter. She also reminded members to visit the 'freebie' table. Business cards for quilters are available on the membership table as well.

Membership: Sherry Williams, Chair welcomed two new members that joined tonight.

Programs & Workshops: Cindy Barszczewski and Sue Womack, Co-Chairs. Carol Hurt and Pam Brown, Assistants (2017). Cindy Barszczewski and Sue Womack announced there is still a need for a chair/committee to take over programs and workshops. The program tonight will be given by Karen French from The French Seam in Stuttgart, AR. The French Seam will be vending tonight as well. Future programs and workshops scheduled for 2018 are as followed: How to make a T-shirt Quilt and why you don't want to by Sue Womack in June, AQG yard sale in July, Antique Quilts in August, Round Robin Demos in October, and Judy Bowers in November. We will have our Christmas party in December.

Sue Womack shared there will be a 'St Nick Rag Santa Claus' workshop by a local teacher Joyce Watson in June, June 9-10, 2018. The workshop will be held at the Southwest Baptist campus and will cost \$40.00 which includes the pattern. Members can register tonight for the workshop, and there are only two slots left. Sue encouraged everyone that will be participating in the 'St Nick Rag Santa Claus' workshop should not wait till the last minute to start cutting out blocks. Judy Bowers will teach a Judy Niemeyer workshop in November. She reminded members that they will start registration for Judy Niemeyer's workshop after the workshop in June. They announced that they have members that have volunteered to help with the yard sale in July.

Judy Stewart also shared she asked a few members to consider chairing programs/workshops last

month but they were unable to take on this position. The guild still needs a future chair/committee for programs/workshops.

Property: Angie Heifner, Chair.

Judy Stewart shared that the guild purchased a new microphone.

Sunshine: Pat Crawford Chair:

No cards were sent. Pat shared to contact her if anyone needs a card of cheer or sympathy.

Old Business:

There will be guidelines in the newsletter about the upcoming garage sale. Garage Sale will be held in July.

The fabric from Geannine Ott's estate sale yielded \$652.75. Liz Simpson shared the money will be applied toward an applique award, two \$50.00 awards per year (one for machine and one for hand applique). These will be judged by Geannine Ott's knot.

New Business:

In October, there will be a round robin of demos. There will be 4-5 individuals performing demos/techniques. There are plans to have two teams to sew after given instructions with a goal to complete a top.

Sue Womack also shared that she has researched a tour bus trip to Missouri Star. Sue would like those that would be interested in going on the trip to sign up tonight. The purpose is only to obtain a list of those that would be interested. The cost would be around \$250.00 and still in the planning phase. She needs to get a number that would be interested before pursuing this further. Sue also plans to contact Missouri Star in regards to dates in early May 2019.

SHOW and TELL

Jackie Bibbs shared *Vintage Flower Pot*, an antique top that was given to her sister-in-law and Jackie guilted.

Sally Martens shared three quilts. First, O.D. Rail Fence, she has been wanting to make an O.D. quilt. This went together in a day and was quilted using rulers. She plans to donate this quilt. Second, *Elephant and Zebra*. This started out as pillow covers which she has had for about 15 years. She is so glad that she was able to make small quilts. Third, *Scraps*, *a* quilt made from leftovers from a larger quilt.

Shannon Young shared *Homemade Halloween Hexies*, an English paper piecing using Halloween themed fabric.

Marilyn Weaver shared *Lone Star*. Her cousin Kay made the quilt top and she quilted on both long arm and an embroidery machine.

Debbie Spinks shared 2 quilts not named. One is a quilt she shared that is 10 years old and the second one is from scraps she constructed last year. **Judy Bowers** shared two quilts. First, *Bali Wedding Star*, a classic pattern in the Niemeyer paper piecing quilting pattern line. She used a Bali pop by Judy Niemeyer to help create the light movement in the arcs. The star points and background fabrics were varied to create color interest. It was beautifully quilted by Eddie Landreth from Benton, AR. Second, *Fractured Star*, a new Judy Niemeyer quilt using one Bali pop plus background fabric. This is a good beginner project to learn basic Niemeyer paper piecing techniques. It was quilted by Shiela Hanneman from Mena, AR.

Pat Crawford shared *Sta*r, a quilt which she plans to donate.

Program notes from 5/15/2018:

The French Seam in Stuttgart

Karen French and Stacey Ferguson treated us to a trunk show with variety of quilts, baby quilts, wall hangings, growth charts, purses and placemats. Many used pre-cuts, and kits as well as other items were available for purchase, with a 10% discount for guild members.

The baby items featured sweet designs with cute sheep, giraffes, butterflies and other creatures by Susy Bleasby, an artist who has painted charming murals at SickKids, a children's hospital in Toronto. When she'd tried to get into art school, she was told she didn't have what it took to be a professional artist. But she persevered doing what she loved and now has a popular fabric line, in addition to the stunning murals. Go to youtube and enter Susy Bleasby to hear her encouraging story.

New must-have tools included a binding tool that makes it easy to join the ends, as well as make a flange, and flexible hoops to use on an embroidery machine. Karen said she enjoys quilting on the machine, and the hoops are easy to move from one quilting space to another.

She recommended Jacquie Gering's book, WALK: Master Machine Quilting with Your Walking Foot.

A set of panels featured RV Glamping (glamour camping). Placemats were made with cork fabric, as well as some with In-R-Foam stabilizer that shows off quilting stitches

They invited everyone to make the trip to Stuttgart – it's just an hour away. And they come to Little Rock about twice a week! (Always a good excuse to stop at Charlotte's in Keo for some pie!)

AQG Yard Sale 2018 Guidelines July 9, 2018

Items should be brought to the meeting and placed on the sale tables.

NO items are to be removed from the tables until the sale starts by direction of the program chair.

Please remember this is a fundraiser for the Guild when marking your items and when purchasing items.

- ➤ All items should be clean and useable.
- Prices should be clearly marked on all item. Use markings that will not damage the material or item.
- ➤ All items placed in bags should be in clear/see through bags.
- Machines and other items should be clearly marked as to working order.

(for example: machine needs new cord, clicking sound from bobbin area, scissors has notch near tip, etc.)

- At some point during the sale the program chair may identify a "half price" time.
- The Program chair can also identify a "freebie" table during the sale. Items can only be added to the freebie table by the person that donated the item!
- ➤ All members should pay for items before taking items from the room.
- > Items left at the end of the night should be collected by the person that donated the items.

Consignment items:

- ❖ All consignment items must be priced at \$25 or higher.
- ❖ The Guild will keep 25% of the item cost and the member will receive 75%.
- Consignment items should be marked with a tag as shown below. (Print a copy from this page or pick up a tag at the meeting.) The tag should be filled out and attached to the item. The tag will be removed from the item when sold.
- Consignees should register their initials with the cashier table before the meeting begins.
- ❖ Tags will be tallied at the <u>end of the sale</u> and every effort will be made to pay the consignees with cash collected. If for some reason the consignee has left for the night, the monies will be held over to the next meeting night.
- ❖ All items not sold should be removed by the consignee.

Quilts without the correct sleeve will not be accepted. Please put quilts in a bag labeled on the outside with your name. Micro Mini Quilts are 12 inches or less on any side and a maximum block size-3 inches. There					
must be a 2" hanging sleeve on back and labeled as above.


